Organisations will need to crowdfund through Spacehive for the remainder of their target. We are looking for projects that are creative, innovative but deliverable. Projects should help meet the priorities and objectives outlined within the North Somerset Corporate Plan. Expected project outcomes for funded projects, would be one or more of the below: Job creation Empty and under-utilised premises brought into use Increasing use of new technology Increase vithin our towns and villages Improved local business confidence Increase in skills, training and volunteer opportunities Increase in visitor spending

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Are you eligible?	 To be eligible for this support your organisation must currently be crowdfunding on North Somerset Council's Spacehive page. Your organisation must be constituted as one of the below: Start up or existing business Local community group acting inclusively to represent a diverse range of local people Resident or trader association Chamber of Commerce Social enterprise Local charity Town Team Neighbourhood Forum Business Improvement District Schools, College, University or other registered educational institute Your organisation must be constituted.

Funding and payment	The maximum match funding amount that can be awarded is 50% of total project costs up to a maximum of £5000.
	50% of the project costs up to a maximum of £5000 will be available for business/community/voluntary organisation/social enterprise projects
	You should not merely apply for the maximum available amount of support (or close to it) just because it's the stated maximum. Your application must clearly demonstrate:
	 costs that would reasonably be expected and justified demonstration of sound budgeting and financial management good value for money
	All costs associated with the venture must be justified, fully broken down explained in satisfactory detail for applications to be properly evaluated.
	Where an application includes the hire or purchase of equipment, items must be properly costed on the basis of quotations from recognised suppliers – the source and details of quotations must also be clearly set out within the application.
	Any project expenditure incurred prior to signing of your Support Offer Letter will not be eligible to be claimed as part of your support.
	Funding will only be released once there is evidence that the organisation has met its crowdfunding target.

Application process	 Applications should be pitched through the Spacehive website at the following link: https://www.spacehive.com/movement/crowdfund -north-somerset Please note that the time from submission of your application to the initial payment could take up to 6 weeks. There are no deadlines for this fund – applications can be submitted at any time. However, projects must ideally be able to be completed 12 months after its start. When we receive your completed application we will confirm receipt, let you know if you need to provide further information, and give an indication of the estimated timeframe for a decision Once the final decision has been made regarding your application we will contact you to confirm whether or not you have been successful.
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Assessing your application	Applications will be assessed by a group of named Officers that will represent the Economic Development, Regeneration, Finance and Strategic Policy departments. The assessment will be based upon your completed application form which details your project, how it complements the priorities and objectives of the North Somerset Economic Plan and Corporate Plan.

	4. Are the costs clear, represent good value for money, well thought through and written quotes provided for larger items?
	5. The sustainability of the project following completion i.e. on-going maintenance, who is going to do it and how will it be paid for?
	 Project Management and delivery - a clear approach to delivering the project, timescales for delivery and responsible persons.
	 Ongoing sources of funding have been identified if vital to secure the continuation of the project, activity
	 How the impact of the project will be measured and monitored during delivery and once completed
	 Alignment of the application to the North Somerset Corporate Plan and the Economic Plan
